Theatre Inside And Out

LEARN EVERYTHING OUTSIDE THE BOUNDS OF THE STAGE

SECTION I - OBJECTIVES:

The objective of Theatre Inside And Out ("TIAO") is to bring technical theatre training to the students attending the program. TIAO will focus on Five major disciplines of technical theatre: Lighting, Sound, Carpentry/Fly, Wardrobe / Hair / Make-Up, Management. The TIAO program will follow closely to the Georgia Standards Of Excellence as detailed later in this document.

SECTION II - STRUCTURE:

TIAO WILL BE STRUCTURED IN A FOUR BY FOUR METHOD. ALL STUDENENTS IN ATTENDANCE WILL RANDOMLY BE BROKEN INTO FOUR GROUPS. EACH GROUP WILL THEN FOLLOW A BLOCK SCHEDULE INORDER TO LEARN IN EACH DISCIPLINE. EACH BLOCK WILL BE FOURTY-FIVE MINUTES LONG AND BE BROKEN INTO TWO PARTS. PART A WILL FOCUS ON THE TEACHING OF THE MATERIAL AND THE STUDENTS LEANING. PART B WILL FOCUS ON THE STUDENTS REAL WORLD APPLICATION OF THE MATERIAL. DETAILED INFORMATION ABOUT WHAT EACH DISCIPLINE WILL TEACH IS OUTLINED BELOW.
